 assigns firmly by this bond sealed  
 with our seals and dated this the 15<sup>th</sup> day  
 of August 1877 the condition of the  
 above obligation is such that whereas  
 the above Bond William L. Black  
 was on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of August 1875  
 elected Justice of the Peace in  
 Beat No. 10, in and said county  
 now if the said William L. Black had  
 faithfully discharged the duties of such  
 office during the time he continues  
 therein on his charge any of the  
 duties thereof then the above obligation  
 to be void otherwise to remain of  
 full force and effect -
