TO THE HONORABLE A. H. ALSTON, SUPERNUMERARY JUDGE OF THE STATE OF ALABAMA AND ACTING JUDGE FOR THE THIRD JUDICIAL CIRCUIT FOR RUSSELL COUNTY, ALABAMA:

Comes the State of Alabama by Hugh L. Black, Solicitor pro tem of the Third Judicial Circuit of Alabama for the Special Term of the Court now being held in Russell County, and shows to the Court that on, to-wit, the 13th day of July, 1916, an order was made by the Honorable J. S. Williams, Judge of the Third Judicial Circuit, in this cause, condemning and forfeiting to the State of Alabama all the prohibited liquors and beverages set forth in the amended return of the Constable to the search warrant issued in this cause, and that the said prohibited liquors and beverages be turned over to the Sheriff of Russell County, and that the said Sheriff should publicly destroy the said prohibited liquors and beverages and the vessels in which they were contained; and movant further shows that the said Sheriff of this County has not destroyed the said prohibited liquors and beverages forthwith as provided, and in accordance with the mandates of law;

Movant further shows to the Court that the said _____ is now a fugitive from justice, and that, although a capias has been issued for him seeking his arrest, he cannot be found, and that as such fugitive from justice he is in contempt of this Court and has no standing in this Court, nor any right to be heard by himself or counsel.

WHEREFORE, Movant prays that this Honorable Court will issue an order commanding the Sheriff to destroy all of said prohibited liquors and beverages, and the vessels in which the same are contained, forthwith, in accordance with the provisions of law.
